## ORDINANCE NO. 2000-43

## AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF MASON, OHIO SECTION 961.04 CHARGES AND BILLING FOR RUBBISH AND WASTE COLLECTION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, seven (7) members elected thereto concurring:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Mason, Ohio, Section 961.04 Charges and Billing, are hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto.

<u>Section 2.</u> That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare and shall be effective immediately upon its passage. The reason for said declaration of emergency is the need to have the rate changes in effect at the earliest possible date.

## EXHIBIT "A"

## 961.04 CHARGES AND BILLING

- (a) The following charges are hereby established for waste collection, in the City:
  - (1) For each single-family unit, the charge shall be eleven dollars (\$11.00) per month effective May 1, 2000. The charge for each single family unit shall be increased to eleven dollars and seventy cents (\$11.70) per month effective May 1, 2001.
  - (2) For each mult-family unit and for each trailer, the charge shall be eleven dollars (\$11.00) per month effective May 1, 2000. The charge for each multi-family unit and for each trailer shall be increased to eleven dollars and seventy cents (\$11.70) per month effective May 1, 2001.
  - (3) For each industrial and commercial establishment, the charge shall be nineteen dollars (\$19.00) per month effective May 1, 2000. The charge for each industrial and commercial establishment shall be increased to twenty dollars (\$20.00) per month effective May 1, 2001. If the total weekly collection from any such establishment is four cans or less, application may be made to the City for a reduction of charge to the current rate then in effect for single and multi-family residential customers. If the average weekly collection is more than ten cans, dumpsters are required.
