

ORDINANCE NO. 2007 - 100

**AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$89,626.09, WITH CDW GOVERNMENT, INC. FOR THE PURCHASE OF FOURTEEN (14) PANASONIC CF-30 TOUGHBOOK MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS; TWO (2) GB OF ADDITIONAL MEMORY FOR EACH; TWENTY (20) MOUNTING SYSTEMS; AND TWENTY (20) CF-30 COMPATIBLE DOCKING STATIONS.**

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has advertised and received bids for the purchase of computer technology and related equipment; and

WHEREAS, State and Local Governments are permitted to purchase items negotiated through this process through the Cooperative Purchasing program; and

WHEREAS, CDW Government Inc. is equal to or less than the best bidder with a price of \$4,931 per computer for the purchase of fourteen (14) Panasonic CF-30 Toughbook Mobile Data Computers; and

WHEREAS, CDW Government Inc. is equal to or less than the best bidder with a price of \$1,000.00 or less each for a docking station/mounting system for the purchase of twenty (20) CF-30 compatible docking stations and mounting systems;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Mason, Ohio, five members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the City of Mason accepts the State's vehicle specifications and agrees that 32 Ford is equal to or less than the best bidder.

Section 2. That the City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract with CDW Government, Inc. for the purchase of fourteen (14) mobile data computers; two (2) GB of additional memory for each; twenty (20) docking stations; and twenty (20) docking stations for use by the police department.

Section 3. That the Finance Director is hereby authorized to pay CDW Government, Inc. the sum of \$89,629.09 for said computers, memory, docking stations and mounting systems.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
