CITY OF MASON COUNCIL MEETING NOVEMBER 22, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 7:11 p.m. Boy Scout Troop 998 led all present as they recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

ATTENDANCE

The following members of Council were present: Michael Gilb, Rich Cox, Tony Bradburn, Charlene Pelfrey, David Nichols, and Don Prince. Christine Shimrock joined the meeting at 7:50 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion to approve the November 1, 2010 Council Meeting Minutes was made by Vice Mayor Nichols, seconded by Councilmember Bradburn. VOTE: ALL YEAS.

RECOGNITION OF CAROL HACKNEY OF MASON SERVES

Ms. Hackney, Mason Serves Coordinator, reported on the success of the October 23 event. With the help of 250 volunteers, 46 homes were served. She thanked Mayor Prince and Councilmember Bradburn for leading two of the teams. She also wanted to thank the City of Mason for their support, along with Quatman Café, Skyline Chili, and Kidd Coffee for their contributions to the event.

RECOGNITION OF SCOTT PIERCE, PRESIDENT OF FESTIVALS OF MASON

Scott Pierce reported that an estimated 9000 to 10,000 people attended this year's Heritage Festival Parade with approximately 2500 people in the parade. He reported that established businesses were pleased with the foot traffic and new faces during the festival. He stated that next year's event will have a new name, The Mason Heritage and Bicycle Festival, and will promote wellness. There will be a morning bicycle race, decorated bikes in the parade, and a route for bicyclists to follow throughout the day (highlighting the City's bike paths). The day will end with a concert on the Plaza. A ten foot Norway Spruce, donated by Pierce's Lawncare and Landscaping, has been planted on the Plaza to be used as the City's Christmas tree during future Christmas in Mason Festivals. Mr. Pierce also recognized the sponsors of the Thursday Night Live Concerts on the Plaza: The Center for Optimal Vitality, Quatman Café, and Culver's.

RESOLUTION 2010-29 COMMENDING TERRY SCHULTE FOR HER OUTSTANDING AND DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE CITY OF MASON, OHIO

Mayor Prince read the Resolution and then presented it to Terry Schulte. Terry then thanked City Council and commended them on their professionalism. During Council discussion, appreciation for Terry's many skills including experience, selfless service, commitment, and effectiveness were mentioned.

Eric Hansen explained that in June, Mason City Schools and the Mason Police Department partnered in writing and submitting a Secure Our Schools Grant. The purpose of this federal grant is to establish and enhance a variety of school safety equipment and/or programs to encourage the continuation and enhancement of school safety efforts in the community. One of the requirements of this grant is that a law enforcement agency must partner with a school district to be eligible for the grant. Eric explained that Mason School District indicated that they would like to fund the purchase of a portable radio system along with repeaters that would allow communication across the entire district. The system would allow direct radio communication between the School Resource Officer (SRO) and the High School Administration at all times. The building is over 700,000 sq. ft. and currently, there are long periods of time when the only electronic communication is by cell phone. During an emergency it is critical that the SRO and High School Administrators have another means of communication to mitigate issues. He stated that the total cost of the system is \$44,950 and the grant is for 50% of that amount, the balance will be paid by the Mason City Schools. The Schools will purchase the system and submit the invoice to the City for reimbursement. Upon receipt of the grant proceeds the City will reimburse the Schools for their purchase. An emergency clause is included to meet grant deadline requirements.

Richard Fair addressed Council and stated that over the last few years the Warren County Engineers Office in cooperation with City staff completed step 5 in a 14-step process for expanding the Western Row Road interchange. The next course of action, according to ODOT's Project Development Process (PDP), is to develop the preferred alternative, which will complete steps 6 & 7. Upon completion of step 5, ODOT agreed to drop the Kings Mills Road Interchange allowing the County and City to focus entirely on the Western Row Road Interchange. ODOT identified four feasible alternatives (two alternates were dropped) for additional review and evaluation as part of this next study. At this point in the process the design team has not been selected; however, we are moving forward with an agreement with the Warren County Commissioners Office to facilitate the process and demonstrate the City's continued commitment. The Warren County Engineer's Office will be the lead agency in this project and City engineering staff will assist with review, management, and final recommendations. Warren County Engineer's Office administers the contract and the City will reimburse the County for expenses. Total estimated cost for

steps 6 and 7 with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ year schedule is around \$1.2 million. The Finance Committee has reviewed this project and is recommending Ordinance 2010 - 120 for adoption.

Eric Hansen explained that the next nine ordinances allocate funds already in the budget for the Community Center Expansion Project. He said that the project has come in under budget with almost \$900,000 saved on contracts closed out so far, which represents a 5.8% savings on the cost of the project. These savings come from three areas: great market timing, staff team work, and creativity.

Richard stated that Ordinance 2010-122 has the change order amount incorrect in the title of the Ordinance and asked that it be corrected from \$11,752.50 to \$15,612.50. He also stated that two remaining ordinances should be expected in 2010 for final contract amounts with Stephen Gross (general trades) and Turner Construction. An emergency clause has been added to these ordinances in order to meet a request by the Finance Director to finalize these in 2010.

Richard Fair addressed Council and explained that the next 14 Ordinances are necessary in order to acquire the remaining right-of-way needed for the improvement of US-42 (Reading Road) from Butler-Warren Road to Tylersville Road and to reimburse the City through bond proceeds for expenses associated with the project. He stated that construction for the improvement of US-42 (Reading Road) from Butler-Warren Road to Tylersville Road requires permanent easements, drainage utility easements and temporary construction easements on 72 parcels including two City parcels, one County parcel and one donated parcel. The City's acquisition consultant, DLZ Inc., has made offers on all 68 parcels and is negotiating with the property owners based on the appraised values. All offers are based on appraisals by ODOT approved certified appraisers and these appraisals have also all been reviewed by an ODOT approved appraiser reviewer as required to meet the federal acquisition requirements. DLZ Inc., have signed easements on 49 parcels. Richard continued by explaining that of the remaining 19 parcels, one parcel (I & O Railways) is in the process of being settled via three party agreement through ODOT, one parcel (US Post Office) can not be appropriated and one parcel is expected to be signed. Resolutions of intent to appropriate have been prepared for the remaining 16 parcels (14 property owners).

Richard stated that at the meeting on November 1, Council took the first step in the appropriation process allowing for all the needed right of way to be acquired by the end of the year as required for the project, with the adoption of Resolutions 2010-15 thru Resolution 2010-28. Property owners were served with the City's intent to appropriate via certified letters. In order to keep the project on schedule the next step is for Council to approve Ordinances 2010 – 130 to 2010 – 143 directing the Law Director to file the appropriation action for each remaining parcel. He said that because these appropriations are related to a road project, the City can use a method known as the "quick-take" process. This means than when the cases are filed, the City can deposit the appraised value of the needed property with the Court and obtain immediate access to the property. That allows the road project to continue even before each appropriation is completed. Richard stated that the City plans to bid this project in March and hopes to have a contract sometime in May. The total amount authorized by these ordinances is \$392,153. The City will continue to negotiate with each property owner. Staff expects to reach a reasonable settlement with some of the property owners before filing. They anticipate the need to file with only 3-4 properties. Authorizing the Ordinances of Intent will allow the City to file for appropriation in case negotiations with any property owner do not succeed and allow for all the needed right of way to be acquired in a timely manner.

Finally, Richard explained that in order for the City to receive reimbursement for expenses paid in advance of the bond issuance, Ordinance 2010 - 144, authorizing reimbursing legislation is necessary. Early next year, staff anticipates the issuance of General Obligation bonds to finance the construction costs for this project. The bonds will be repaid from revenue in the State Highway Fund.

Both Warren County and the City of Mason are obligated by State statute to pay for a Public Defender for those individuals who cannot afford to pay for their defense for serious offenses that are heard in Mason Municipal Court. A Public Defender is appointed to represent such people and receives compensation from either the County or City according to state statutes. The County is eligible for partial reimbursement of their public defender expenses from the Ohio Public Defender's Office if a cooperative agreement exists between the City and County regarding public defender expenditures. Since 2004, the County has requested that the City authorize an agreement that would formalize the practice and allow the County to pursue reimbursement from the State. The County is now requesting annual renewal of this agreement to meet State of Ohio requirements.
